"Universities for EU Projects" finances the traineeship of students selected by a consortium of 9 major Italian universities to improve their skills in the sector of EU project design and implementation of the project activities.

Requirements to participate as host organization

- The receiving organisation can be any public or private organisation active in the labour market, for example:
 - o a public or private, a small, medium or large enterprise (including social enterprises);
 - o a public body at local, regional or national level;
 - a social partner or other representative of working life, including chambers of commerce, craft/professional associations and trade unions;
 - o a research institute; a foundation;
 - o a school/institute/educational centre (at any level, from preschool to up-per secondary education, and including vocational education and adult education);
 - o a non-profit organisation, association, NGO;
 - o a body providing career guidance, professional counselling and information services.

- o a Programme Country HEI awarded with an ECHE
- The receiving organizations must be based in one of the Erasmus + Programme Countries, with the exception of Italy (in order to respect the transnationally of the mobility):
 - o EU Countries: Austria, Greece, United Kingdom, Belgium, Ireland, Czech Republic, Bulgaria, Romania, Cyprus, Latvia, Slovakia, Croatia, Lithuania, Slovenia, Denmark, Luxembourg, Spain, Estonia, Malta, Sweden, Finland, Netherlands, Hungary, France, Poland, Germany, Portugal.
 - Non-EU Countries: Iceland, Liechtenstein, Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Norway.
- The following types of organisations are not eligible as receiving organisations for student traineeships: EU institutions and other EU bodies including specialised agencies (their exhaustive list is available on the website ec.europa.eu/institutions/index_en.htm); organisations managing EU programmes such as national agencies (in order to avoid a possible conflict of interests and/or double funding).

Role of the host organizations

- Provide students with necessary information and support to perform their tasks;
- Agree and implement the contents of the mobility agreement;
- Evaluate the experience and disseminate the results.

Procedure for the selection of trainees

Host Organizations can access the database of EuGen and view the profiles of students participating in the project. Equally, students can view the host organizations description uploaded in the database and available to host interns.







Host organizations and students can freely take contacts one with the other to propose a Skype interview and a matching. Databases will be accessible on EuGen website www.eu-gen.org from the 8th February.

Timing

- Deadline for Hosting organization to participate: 5th February 2017
- Deadline for accepting one or more students: 26th February 2017
- Period for the mobility: between 15th March 2017 and 31st December 2017
- Length of the mobility: from 2 to 9 months, with priority for minimum 4 months motilities

Financial support for students

Participant students receive a grant of 430 EUR or 480 EUR according to the country of destination; specific costs for participants with disabilities are paid by the project.

Students are covered by insurance for workplace accidents and civil liability against third parties.

Housing is organized and paid by the students themselves.

Receiving organizations have no costs and don't receive any financial support from the project.

Language and technical support for the students

Students will undertake a language test on the OLS (the online language support tool developed by the European Commission) before the departure and improve their skills through it during their mobility.

To improve their technical skills in European projects' design, selected students will have access to online courses on European projects design, and additional support material, published by EPA and European Academy.
